

NATIONAL COMMISSION FOR WOMEN LAUNCHES ANTI-HUMAN TRAFFICKING CELL



STOP HUMAN TRAFFICKING !

The National Commission for Women launched an Anti-Human Trafficking Cell on 2nd April 2022 to improve effectiveness in tackling cases of human trafficking, raising awareness among women and girls, capacity building and training of Anti Trafficking Units and to increase responsiveness of Law Enforcement Agencies.

The Cell has been set up with an aim to enhance awareness among Law Enforcement Officials and to facilitate their capacity building. The Cell will conduct Gender Sensitization Trainings and Workshops in combating human trafficking for Police Officers and for Prosecutors at regional, state and district level. The complaints related to human trafficking received by the Commission will be addressed by this Cell.

The Commission has observed that some of the major issues faced in combating trafficking include lack of rehabilitation for survivors and insensitive attitude towards trafficked survivors and their families. Therefore, the Cell will improve monitoring mechanism and encourage Government Agencies regarding measures being adopted for prevention of trafficking and rehabilitation of survivors.

The Cell will also help survivors of trafficking in rebuilding their lives by providing them with need-based training and by organizing capacity building programs for them to prevent re-trafficking of survivors.

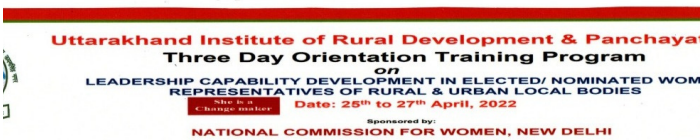
NCW organises Workshop for Chairpersons State Commissions for Women

The National Commission for Women organised 3-day trainings under its 'She The Changemaker' program for Capacity Building of Women in politics in the states of Telangana, Tripura, Kerala and Uttarakhand. In Telangana, NCW organised third batch of its training program in collaboration with Telangana State Institute of Rural Development. Women sarpanchs took part in the training. In Kerala, the trainings were organised in collaboration with Kerala Institute of Local Administration. Women representatives of Panchayati Raj Institutions and Urban Local Bodies took part in the training.

The third batch of the training programs were held in Tripura along with the State Institute of Public Administration and Rural Development in April. Women representatives of Panchayati Raj Institution and Urban Local Bodies participated in the training. The last training batch for Uttarakhand was also held in April in collaboration with State Institute of Rural Development and Panchayati Raj. Women members of Panchayati Raj Institutions and Urban Local Bodies participated in the training program.
