Ms. Jyotsna Chatterji is the director of the Joint Women's Programme in New Delhi, India and Vice President of YWCA India. She serves as a member of many human rights groups in India and Asia including the Delhi State Social Welfare Advisory Board, the Core Group on Prevention of Child Prostitution (National Commission for Women), the Core Group National

Commission on Human Rights, the Central Advisory Committee on Child Prostitution (Ministry of Human Resources). She was a Professor of English Literature at the University of Calcutta until 1978, when she became the director of the Joint Women's Programme. Ms. Chatterji has been working an issues relating to women, such as a denial of justice, question of property rights, equal pay for equal work, changes in personal laws, downy-demand and other atractities on women.



Kiran Devi Bharti from Banda, Ultar Prodesh is a prominent person known for dance, music and theatre. She has displayed her mentor in the BERIN form of art.
